# Australia 1966





- 26 January- Robert Menzies, Australia's longest-serving Prime Minister, retires and is succeeded by Harrold Holt.
- The Beaumont children are abducted during a visit to Glenelg beach in Adelaide and are never seen again.
- 14 February Decimalisation of the Australian currency; the Australian dollar replaces the
- Australian pound at the rate of ten shillings to the dollar.
- The Australian Workers' union affiliates with the Australian Council of Trade Union
- The severe drought which has stricken large areas of Australia since 1957,
   particularly in rural NSW and Queensland, if finally eased by widespread rains.
- Jack <u>Brabham</u> is named Australian of the year.
- The first National Service conscriptions fly out from Richmond RAAF base In Sydney bound for Vietnam.
- 7 April NSW repeals the Sunday Observance Act, allowing theatres and cinemas to open, sporting events to charge admission and clubs to sell alcohol on Sundays
- 21 June Federal ALP leader Arthur Calwell is injured in an assassination attempt by 19-yearold Peter Kocan.
- Japan replaces Great Britain as Australia's largest trading partner.
- The council for the <u>Defence</u> of Government Schools is formed in Melbourne
- General Motors Holden becomes the first local car manufacturer to install seat belts as standard equipment in all vehicles.
- The Prince of Wales arrives in Australia to attend Geelong Grammar School's exclusive Timbertop preparatory school.
- The Federal government announces the formation of a military Task Force, in creasing Australia's commitment to the Vietnam War to 4,500.
- Victoria extends hotel trading hours from 6pm to 10pm, ending the infamous "Six O'clock Swill". Driving with a blood alcohol level over 0.05% becomes a criminal offence.
- Australian forces engage in their first major battle in Vietnam at the Battle of Long Tan.
- 22 September Ansett-ANA Flight 149 crashes near Winton, Queensland, killing all 24 people on board.

The birds are gone, the world is white, The winds are wild, they chill and bite; The ground is thick with slush and sleet, And I can barely feel my feet.







Beef Stroganoff first appeared In Russian cookbooks in the mid 1800s, presumably named for a prominent member of the Stroganoff family.

The dish became popular in the U.S. om the 1950s from servicemen retarning from Europe and China after WW11.

#### Beef Stroganoff

PREP TIME 10 mins
COOK TIME 20 mins
TOTAL TIME 30 mins

SERVINGS 4 servings

NOTE: It helps to cut thin strips of the beef by putting the meat into the freezer for 20 to 30 minutes first. If you substitute yogurt for the sour cream, use full fat yogurt, and make sure to take the pan off the heat before stirring it in or it may curdle.

Ingredients

5 tbls butter

500g top sirloin or tenderloin, cut into think strips

1/3 cup chopped shallots

500g mushrooms, sliced

Salt to taste

1/8 nutmeg

1/2 tsp dry tarragon or 2tsp fresh tarragon

1 cup of sour cream at room temperature.

Method

Brown beef strips | 3 tb|s butter in large pan.

Cook quickly browning both sides. While cooking sprinkle generously with salt and pepper.

Remove to a bowl and set aside.

Sauté the shallots:

In the same pan, cook the shallots for a minute or two allowing them to soak up any meat drippings. Add to bowl with meat, set aside.

Sauté the mush rooms:

Same pan add 2 this butter increase heat and add the mushrooms. Cook, stirring occasionally for about 4 minutes. While cooking sprinkle with nutmeg and tarragon.

Add sour cream, beef, shallots:





Reduce the heat to low and add sour cream. Mix thoroughly. Do not let it come to a simmer or boil or the sour cream may curdle. Stir in the beef and shallots.

Serve immediately over egg noodles, fettuccine, mashed potatoes, or rice. Yum
