The 2023 Anzac Appeal has concluded and despite a cold and cloudy start we did not see much rain and finished with some great autumn sun. Once again everyone made it safely to the end despite Dieter again fighting with the flu throughout.

As usual, the roster was firmly in place at the start and then the whistle blew. Many thanks to those that answered my late night/early morning calls and texts; closing and opening tables and redirecting them to new locations; lots of new acquaint-ances were made as a result. I must make special mention of Jan, Tim and Dennis for their assistance here.

A new twist this time was being evicted from Rosenthal on day 2 due to not having the correct Lease Agreement in place. This caught us by surprise as we had followed the same process as usual. With a bit of crisis management we were able to get things sorted and were back in place with our paperwork in hand (with a loss of 5 days trading). Andy pledged to read the Lease thoroughly to ensure we were complying but couldn't get past page 1 of legaleeze.



## Nurse Vivian Bullwinkle

The \$20 Nurse Bullwinkle badge would have to be one of the most popular badges we have ever sold. We sold all 200 of our badges within 3 days and despite a continued demand we could not get any more during the appeal. (sorry, obviously I did not order enough) Most of us met someone who knew her or worked with her, as well as many who did not know of her previously but were moved by the story of her service/experiences.

Whilst returning the EFTPOS machines to the warehouse we discussed the badge with the staff. RSL Vic purchased 35,000 nurse badges and allocated them by ratio to the subbranches that asked for them as well as to special events (eg: MCG Anzac match). We saw a box with a bag of nurse badges that they identified as leftovers from the MCG. Ty agreed to give them to us (before I had to twist his arm) so we had an **extra 50** to sell immediately. Deb quickly put the word out and we had sold 7 before we got home.

## 2023 Anzac Appeal Wrap-up

If they run another batch next year, we will increase our order significantly.



## **STATS** (because everyone loves stats)

When allocating available sellers, safety and support was always the first priority.

We had eight tables for the planned 12 days of sales; plus 2 extra Sundays at Bunnings: 98 table days

We had nine instances (incl the 5 at Rosenthal) when tables did not sell at various locations due to lack of sellers/eviction: -9 table days

We had one instance of sellers working on a Sun: +1 table day

We had 15 instances where we had only one seller at a location (last time it was 30): 15

We had one day when all eight tables had 2 sellers - yahoo

## **EFTPOS Machines**

As a result of feedback from previous appeals, EFTPOS machines were located at all tables for this appeal. This proved to be very beneficial, although battery issues required one to be pulled out of service after a week and others required additional charging. We will now consider requesting spare machines to cover this issue and have them available for other sites/special events.

We discussed our issues with warehouse staff and we will provide written feedback for them to discuss with ANZ (machine providers).

EFTPOS machines accounted for 36% of sales, with the largest individual transaction being \$255

## Result

Sellers were busy throughout the appeal and generally confident of a good result, with many setting best daily figures for their sites. The current total **(TBC by RSL HQ)** raised during the appeal was: \$60,954.33

This is still climbing due to the extra nurse badges.

This is a record amount by a large margin.

Once again, an example of how generous the people of Sunbury and local area are in supporting the RSL, our veterans and their families. Much of the total raised was because of straight **donations (5%)** from the public.

Thank you to everyone who assisted with sales, both sellers and their support teams; it cannot happen without you. A special thanks to **Josh** who took a tray to his workplace and **raised over \$1500**. Be proud of your efforts in ensuring Sunbury RSL can continue to provide support to our local veterans and their families.

For now, put your feet up and take a well-earned rest. (Planning has already started for the 2023 Poppy Appeal [28 Oct – 11 Nov TBC])





**Bowling Evening** 





## Pot Roast Chicken with Garlic and Thyme



## 14 Ingredients

## 1.4kg chicken pieces on the bone

- 2 tbsp plain flour
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 2 leeks, pale section only, thinly sliced
- 300g cup mushrooms
- 1 cup (250ml) dry white wine
- 2 tsp Continental Superb
   Stock Chicken Powder
- 2 cups (500ml) boiling water
- 1 tbsp tomato paste
- ① 1 tbsp wholegrain mustard
- ① 12 garlic cloves, unpeeled
- 12 thyme sprigs
- Mashed potato, to serve
- Green beans, to serve
- Select all ingredients

## 3 Method Steps

## Step 1

Preheat oven to 160°C. Place the <u>chicken</u> and <u>flour</u> in a bowl. Toss to coat. Heat half the <u>oil</u> in a heavy-based casserole pan over medium heat. Add half the chicken. Cook for 2-3 mins each side or until golden. Transfer to a plate. Repeat with the remaining chicken.

## Step 2

Heat the remaining oil in the pan. Add the <u>leek</u> and <u>mushrooms</u>. Cook, stirring, for 2 mins or until leek softens. Add the <u>wine</u> and cook, scraping the base of the pan, for 1 min. Add the <u>stock powder</u>, boiling <u>water</u>, <u>tomato paste</u>, <u>mustard</u>, <u>garlic</u> and half the <u>thyme</u>. Stir to combine. Return the chicken to the pan. Cover and bake for 1 1/4 hours or until the chicken is cooked through. Uncover and bake for a further 15 mins or until the sauce thickens. Season with a little extra stock powder, if necessary.

## Step 3

Serve the chicken mixture with <u>mashed potato</u>, green beans and remaining thyme.
